Impact Report July 2022 - Dec 2023

Summary

The Liv Foundation completed its first full year of operations in Dec 2023 working closely with its launching partners to support and strengthen the The Cholankande Youth Training Centre (CYTC) which is located in a rural, remote location in Nawalapitiya, Sri Lanka. The foundation invested a total of €31,500 directly into the project and worked closely with the school's administration to help improve operations.

Thanks to the generous contributions of our donors and collaboration with the foundation, the school was able to continue operations and...

- Reach a total of 244 students during this period
- Improve staff welfare and performance through salary increments and scholarships for further study
- Initiate a scholarship programme to encourage and support top-performing students
- · Offer supporting programmes to students in health education, first aid, and English free of charge
- Procure key equipment and consumables needed for programme delivery



About the CYTC staff...

The school operates with a small team of 12 - 5 teachers, 5 office workers, and 2 daily maintenance workers. The core team is made up of longstanding employees who have been with the school for years — 2 teachers, are past students of the school and Mr Navaratne, the CYTC motor mechanics instructor, has been with the school for over 20 years

The partnership has helped 3 new recruits join the CYTC team: 1 English teacher, a electrical sci. instructor and 1 accountant



About the students...

The students are largely at-risk youth unable to afford private education and without the grades to get into public schools that offer free education. They are between the ages of 16-20. They are all hoping to secure wellpaying jobs to escape poverty and a majority dream of building international careers. Top students are encouraged to teach and are offered paid placements at the school.

During the partnership period 4 students were offered teaching placements with mentoring



Diversity & inclusion

Compassion is at the heart of school's operations. The school's goal is to reach the most vulnerable and uplift them to their fullest-capacity regardless of gender, religion or ethnicity. The focus is on breaking social barriers born out of language, ethnicity, and economic divides. The introduction of an English programme has been pivotal in this regard, helping to build a common language and unlock new opportunities for students.
